She gives generously of her personal time, logging over 430 hours of volunteer hours with no expectation of recognition or reward. What's most remarkable is the consistency of her service. Colleen doesn't volunteer when it's convenient—she volunteers because she believes in the mission and the people we serve.

Her long-term commitment is measured not only in hours served but in the range and reach of her impact. From disaster shelters to blood donation centers, Colleen supports life-changing and life-saving efforts every single week. Her dependability and heart-centered service have made her an indispensable part of both our local and regional

volunteer force.

Colleen has played a crucial role in our disaster response efforts, stepping up time and time again to serve community members in crisis. Over the past two years, she has been part of 6 local and national-scale Disaster Response Operations. These large-scale events have included hurricanes, wildfires, and severe storms, where Colleen has worked alongside teams from across the country to help stabilize impacted communities and provide essential services in times of great need.

Her work extends to local sheltering efforts as well. In January of 2025, a Hickory apartment complex caught fire, displacing over 30 individuals, requiring the opening of emergency shelters. Colleen was one of the first volunteers on scene, ensuring that displaced individuals had not just a roof over their heads, but a safe and dignified space to begin recovery. During this operation personally took on the responsibility of caring for a guest and their cat, ensuring both pet and owner felt safe, seen, and supported. The year before that, tornados swept through claremont, demolishing several homes and displacing a dozen individuals. Colleen, was once again, ready to respond and dedicated her time to ensuring those reovering were fed and felt reassured that they were not alone in what they were facing.

Colleen's actions consistently fill urgent gaps in care and reflect her deep understanding of human needs during disaster. Her leadership, compassion, and quick responsiveness have directly improved service delivery and helped hundreds of individuals recover with dignity and support.

She knows how to speak with individuals in trauma, de-escalate tense situations, and offer comfort without overstepping. Beyond her work on the ground, Colleen has developed strong ties with local organizations and small businesses across Catawba County. Her ability to cultivate these relationships has strengthened community trust in our agency and opened doors for ongoing collaboration and support.





That simple but powerful statement perfectly captures Marc's commitment to volunteering with the program. Marc does what is right and what is most needed, rather than what is easy.

Over the past six years, Mar has served several children through some of Catawba

County's most challenging Guardian ad Litem cases. Despite the complexity and emotional difficulty of these cases, every child assigned to Marc has ultimately achieved permanency in a safe nurturing environment. In a county where over 100 children are currently without a Guardian ad Litem volunteer, Marc's willingness to take on high need cases ensures that some of the most vulnerable children are not left without an advocate.

Marc's contributions extend well beyond his direct advocacy work. He actively supports the GAL program's broad mission by helping to recruit additional volunteers from his personal and professional networks. He participates in recruitment events and connects the program with other community organizations to expand is reach and impact.

In addition, Marc's involvement with the Kiwanis Club has been instrumental in raising funds for the Catawba Valley Guardian ad Litem Association (CVGAL), which provides critical support for children served by the GAL program. These funds allow children to participate in sports, organized recreational activities and academic programs that help them heal and thrive. Currently, Ralph comes every Monday and Wednesday mornings to do the Target grocery run and then sort the frozen meat donations and organize the freezer. He's also been know to come in on an afternoon when he doesn't have anything else going on. Ralph is also more than willing to pitch in with anything we need him to do when we find ourselves shorthanded or in a pinch. Ralph is just one of those amazing volunteers who you know is always going to be there and will always get the job done.

Describe nominee's accomplishments and how their service has helped meet critical needs in our community. (300 words maximum)

Driving to our local stores to pick up grocery donations is one of the most important jobs we have for volunteers at Ashure Ministry. Six days a week, we go to a number of different stores and pick up these donations that we then distribute to our clients. These donations can consist of produce, dairy/deli items, frozen meats, baked goods, dried goods, and much more. To do this job, a volunteer must be able to maintain good relations with the stores they visit, organize the donations as they pick them up so that they can be weighed properly (Second Harvest requires that we weigh each stores donations individually and by category), and also alert our staff to any extra pick ups or

other issues that may occur, as well as be responsible with our company vehicles on the road.

Ralph has been doing these grocery runs for us for years. He loves doing the runs and has always taken on these tasks with great dedication. Ralph currently does our weekly runs to the Hickory Target on Monday and Wednesday mornings. These are some of our biggest and most involved grocery runs. Not only does Ralph have to load the van, but he also has to go through the store to collect all of the donations. It takes a lot of extra work and organizing to do the Target pick ups, and Ralph never fails. He also is more than willing to fill in for other drivers when they can't do their scheduled runs, or to come in holidays to do pick ups for us. Ralph is one of volunteers who really helps to keep Ashure Ministry running smoothly.

Describe nominee's special skills, qualities and/or leadership qualities. (300 words maximum)

Ralph's skills at organizing are quite impressive. When Ralph first started with us, one of the first things he did was help us to organize our freezer. At that time, we would label our meat boxes by date, but then just stack them in the freezer as they came in, without much thought to any real system of rotation or spacing. As fate would have it, Ralph worked with a group of school kids one day trying to consolidate our meat boxes a little to create space in the freezer. He very quickly saw what we were doing and what we were up against, and then revamped our entire system.

Instead of just dating and throwing the boxes in as they came (full or not), Ralph began unpacking the partial boxes and then repacking them to full capacity. By doing this, we has able to make sure each box maintained its full shape. As such, they could be stacked much tighter, and there was no worry of partial box collapsing under the weight of heavier boxes on top of it. By doing all of these things, Ralph managed to nearly triple the amount of meat we were able to store in our walk-in freezer. Since starting this system, Ralph has stayed with it to make sure we maintain everything he established. He's taught his system to our employees and several volunteers who now help him. This system has done wonders to improve the amount and quality of meat we are able to provide our clients and to make life so much easier on us in the Pantry.

Explain why you nominated this person(s) for the Giving From the Heart Award. (300 words maximum)

Ralph is just one of those special volunteers who helps to make Ashure Ministry feel like a family. Ralph has a very distinct personality and he finds his own ways to get a smile and

a laugh out of everybody. You never know what might come out of his mouth sometimes. One of his best quips had to do with some chicken we received one time. The boxes were labeled as "Smart Chicken." Ralph saw that said, "Well good, I'm glad they sent us some Smart Chickens. We don't want any of them dumb chickens." We all just looked at each other and shook our heads. "Only Ralph could come up with something like that."

Ralph is definitely one of a kind. He always comes in with a smile on his face, and even when he's finding something to gripe about, he always does it with a chuckle. He's just one of those volunteers you look forward to seeing every week, and you just couldn't imagine the place without. We are just so grateful for everything he does for Ashure Ministry and the joy he brings with him every time he comes into work.


