Emma Pierce has been engaged in volunteer work with the Kindness Project for just over a year. What began as a weekend activity to fulfill Beta Club requirements has evolved into a genuine passion for assisting others. The Kindness Project is an organization dedicated to providing support for homelessness and various crisis assistance services within Catawba County. The organization is operated by five core volunteers and is supported by individuals like Emma, who are committed to fostering positive change within the community. No task is too large or too small for Emma, as she consistently seeks opportunities to contribute. While some weeks may not appear as remarkable as others, Emma remains poised to participate with an optimistic mindset. Over the past year, she has contributed to preparing snack bags for the Sunday Outreach program, which provided over 4,600 meals last year, as well as wrapping Doughnuts from Krispy Kreme and assembling PBJ sandwiches. Following the impact of Hurricane Helene last fall, she promptly reached out to inquire how she could assist the organization with hurricane relief efforts. Despite attending college classes (as a junior in high school), the week after the storm, she still managed to dedicate time to preparing sandwiches for first responders and volunteers in affected areas, in addition to aiding in the loading of supplies collected for the mountain regions.

Describe nominee's accomplishments and how their service has helped meet critical needs in our community. (300 words maximum)

Emma dedicates her time to assisting the Kindness Project by preparing snack bags and

distributing meals for the Sunday Outreach Program, which offers vital support to individuals experiencing food insecurity by providing a warm meal. These meals not only address immediate hunger but also serve as a foundation for building trust and encouraging individuals to seek further assistance.

Emma not only dedicates her time to volunteering with the Kindness Project but also engages in various community activities whenever she is available. In November of last year, Emma joined Shurtape Technologies employees and their families for the inaugural WHKY Turkey Drop. This event, which spanned the entire day, involved the collection of turkeys, canned goods, and other non-perishable items for the benefit of the Second Harvest Food Bank of Hickory. Thanks to these efforts, Emma and the team successfully gathered 52 turkeys, three pallets of non-perishable food items, and \$2,000 in cash contributions to assist those in need within the community.

During the 2023-2024 academic year, Emma provided her support to the First United Methodist Church in Hickory by assisting with their Cub Camp program. Throughout this period, she worked with K-2 students from Southwest Elementary, which is recognized as one of the most economically challenged schools in Catawba County, contributing over 30 hours of her time on Wednesday evenings. Emma offered homework assistance, reviewed new learning materials, facilitated outdoor activities to ensure student safety, engaged in games after homework completion, read to the children, and more. The time she devoted to these students not only made them feel valued but also helped to enhance their confidence. The students expressed their enthusiasm upon seeing Emma each Wednesday, and the Program Coordinator remarked, "Emma has been a tremendous asset to their program."

Kyra is a very talented athlete and plays on different teams throughout the school year at Bunker Hill High School. Even with all of that, she still finds time to come to Ashure Ministry to volunteer. Most of the time she's coming with her grandparents and her little brother, but she also finds times to come on her own as well.

Kyra is a member of our inaugural class of S.E.E.D. interns. The Ashure Ministry S.E.E.D. Internship (Service, Engagement, Experience, & Development) is a new initiative we started this year. It is a yearlong program designed to give the interns a firsthand view of inner workings of Ashure Ministry, nonprofits, and the community service sector. Kyra was actually the first intern to sign up. For this program, our interns have to complete at least 50 hours of volunteer service (15 in the Pantry, 15 in the store, and at least 1 with our Case Managers). They then must write an Impact Story that we can use in one of our publications, and write a reflection paper at the end of the year.

Our interns are also required to do a special project. Kyra did a food drive at her school. She set it up as a competition between upper class men (Seniors & Juniors) and lower class men (Sophomores & Freshmen). She designed her own flyers. She organized things

with the school. And she put out barrels to collect the food donations. Kyra managed to bring in a very impressive haul at a much needed time as Ashure Ministry is seeing more food clients than ever before.

When Kyra comes to work, she comes to work. Many teenagers will be fairly lackadaisical when they come to volunteer, but not Kyra. She tears through any task she's given. She also tries to stay on top of those she's working with. You can hear her encourage her little brother to stay on task anytime they're put together or joke around with her grandpa about keeping up.

Kyra has also proven to be quite versatile. It seems that she excels at any task she's put on. Whether in the Pantry or in the Store, it doesn't take her long to master whatever it is she's doing, no matter how complicated. This is incredibly valuable to us because we know that we can plug her in wherever we need her anytime she comes. Volunteers with Kyra's mindset and ability are such an asset to a workplace like Ashure Ministry.

When we started the S.E.E.D. Internship program at Ashure Ministry, we really weren't sure what we were going to get. We had high hopes, but you also never know. And we are so glad that she has been a part of Ashure Ministry over the past couple of years, and we hope this relationship will continue for many more!
